

What happens if they ask me a question that we will cover on a future lesson?


That's a very good question! We are going to have a whole lesson on that subject a little later on. If you don't mind, can we discuss it more thoroughly at that time?


What if they ask a question I don't know the answer to.

That's a good question. But, to tell you the truth, I've not thought about that question before. I will study it out this week and share what I've learned next week.




That's a good question. I'm not sure what the Bible says about it. What have you found or heard?












One of the most effective ways to handle objections and reach the heart is to use the three Fs:


- Feel "I understand the way you feel."
- Felt "Many others in your situation have felt exactly the same way."
- Found "But they have found..."
